Description Discover the full potential of PAT data and elevate your assessment practice. Understanding PAT is a hands-on, highly practical workshop designed for educators who want to implement PAT confidently and harness the Progressive Achievement approach to support student growth.

Focusing on Maths and Reading domains, you'll navigate a complete PAT cycle – from initial account setup, assessment policy and test administration, to accessing and interpreting student results data and identifying meaningful next steps in learning. Using real examples, tutorials, and case studies, you'll learn how to transform assessment insights into targeted, effective teaching strategies.

This workshop focuses on PAT reporting and data interrogation, giving you the tools to understand what your students know, what they're ready to learn next, and how to monitor progress over time. School engagement events and offers

Description ACER offers a range of professional learning opportunities designed for educators who want to deepen their understanding of PAT and other ACER assessments. These sessions support school staff responsible for administering assessments, interpreting data, and implementing evidence-informed teaching and learning strategies.

Schools can choose from short consultations, extended video conferences, or tailored half-day and full-day workshops. Each option provides practical guidance, opportunities for discussion, and support in analysing school-specific data. Workshops can be delivered on-site, with travel and accommodation costs applying for face-to-face visits.

These offerings are designed for individual schools, with additional arrangements available for networks, systems, or multi-school groups.

Video conferences / face-to-face school sessions

Initial Consultation (20 minutes) - Free of charge

Each session is a short online 20-minute discussion and can cover an introduction to PAT or other ACER assessments. This is a great opportunity to ask questions about the assessments, explore how they work, how they were developed, and have relaxed, informal conversations about assessment practice more broadly.

- Introductory conversation about implementing PAT or other ACER assessments
- General queries and informal conversation about assessment practice

Extended Consultation (90 minutes) – \$710.00 inc. GST

A 90-minute session can be tailored to focus on one or two key areas, such as a PAT overview, understanding PAT Adaptive, interrogating PAT reports, or monitoring learning growth. Each session provides depth on selected topics rather than covering all areas at once, ensuring meaningful discussion and practical application.

These sessions support educators to deepen their understanding of PAT and strengthen their use of assessment data to inform teaching and learning.
