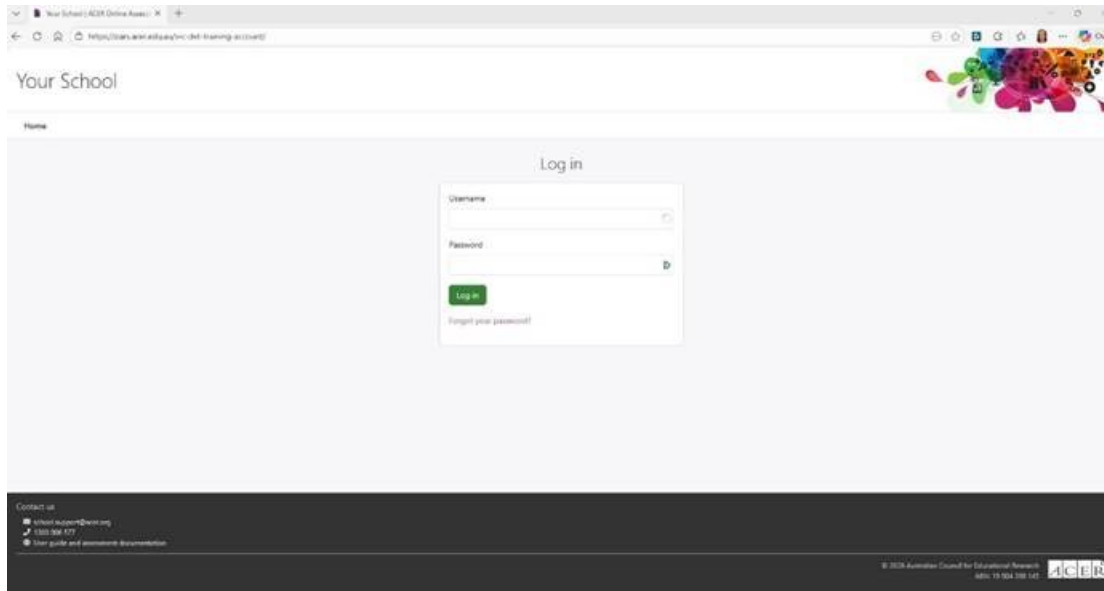
Practice Section demonstration script

Hello students.

One day this week or next, you will be completing an online maths test in the classroom. We want to make sure that you know what to expect, so today, I will show you what the maths test looks like.

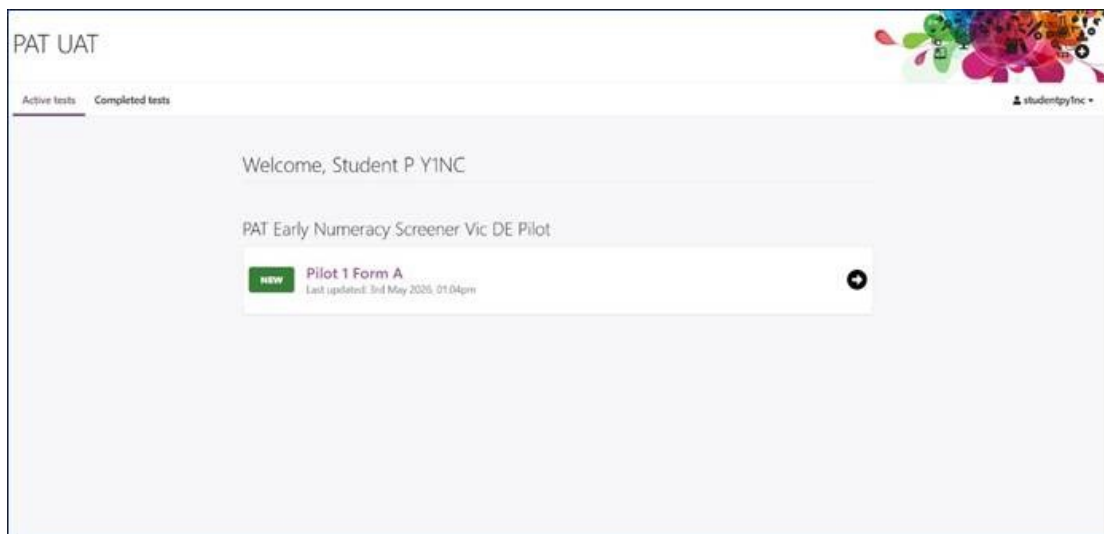
*When it's time for you to complete your maths test, your teacher will ask you to log in to the test. You will get to this **login page** by visiting your school's own website which will look something like this:*





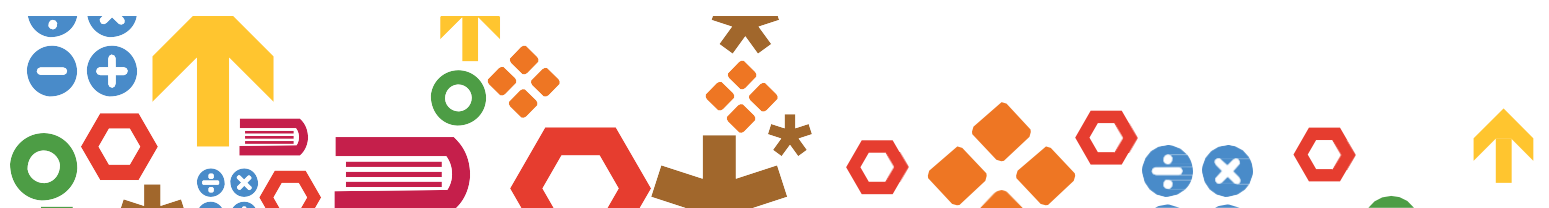
Your teacher will ask you to type in your very own username and password. Make sure you ask for help if you need it – this can be a tricky step and it's important that you get it right.

Once you've typed in your username and password, your teacher will ask you to click the green login button.



On the next screen, you will see your name at the top of the screen and the name of your maths test in the middle of the screen. It's important you wait for your teacher's instructions before you click anything else.

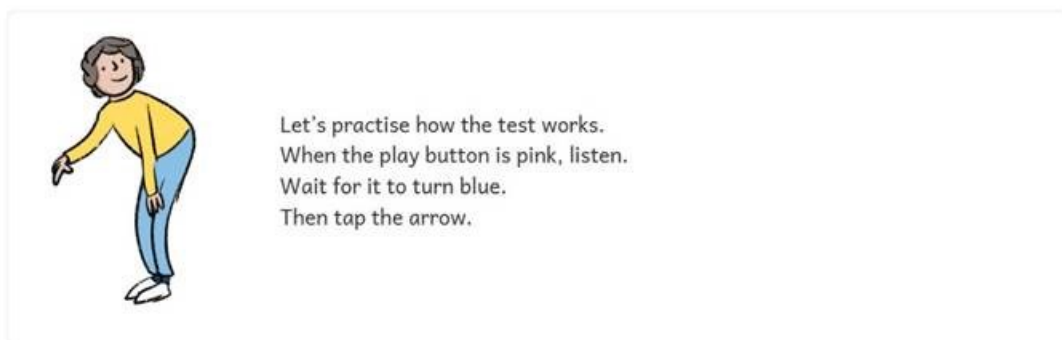
When your teacher asks you to, click the arrow in the black circle to open your test.





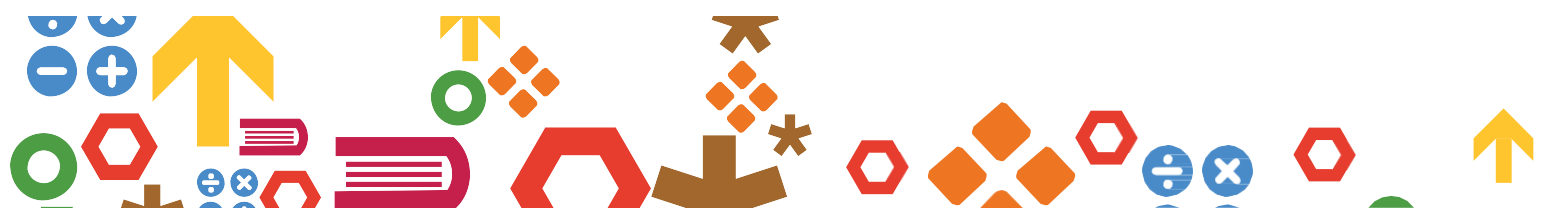
On the next screen, you will see your name in big writing at the top of the screen.

When your teacher asks you to, you will need to put on your headphones and click the arrow. After you do this, you will see words on the screen, which will be read aloud to you. A pink button will appear while the words are being read aloud.



*Now, **tap** the arrow. Depending on which device you use to complete your test, you might need to **tap** on the screen or **click** on the arrow using the mouse or trackpad.*

On the next screen, you will see some more words on screen, which will be read aloud to you again. You will be asked to listen to the words again.





Tap the play button to listen again.
Then tap the arrow.



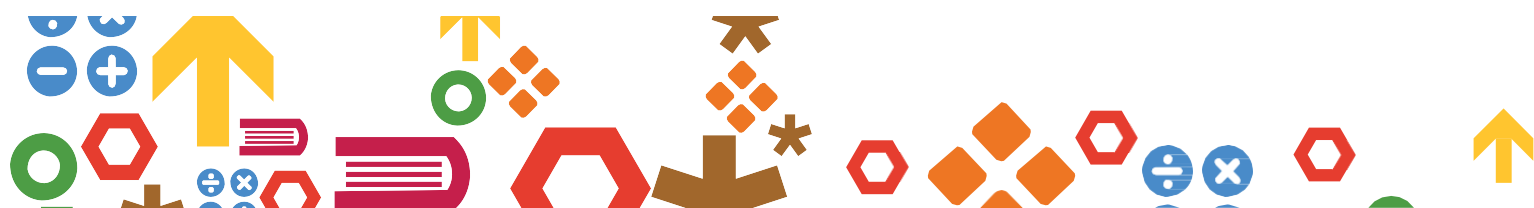
*When you complete your maths test, for most questions, you will be able to replay the audio if you need to listen again. For some questions though, the audio **replay** button will disappear if you try to click it. That's just how this activity works — just try your best each time.*

In your maths test, you will be asked to tap on things that appear on screen. I'm going to click the arrow to move to the next screen now, and we will see an example of how to tap on things that appear on screen.

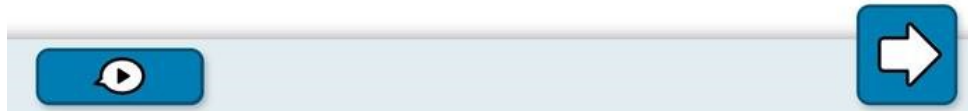
Tap the apple.
Make sure it has a blue border.



We can see that the apple has an orange border. Watch what happens when I tap it...



Tap the apple.
Make sure it has a blue border.



Now the apple has a blue border, just like we need to make sure. When we see the blue border, we know that we have tapped successfully.

That's the end of my introduction. For the rest of this video, I will show you some practice questions. When you log in to complete your own test, you will see these exact same questions. They are **practice** questions to help you get used to tapping on the screen of your device OR clicking the mouse.

I will tap each button to hear it.

I will now select the button that says 'one'.

Notice how the border turned blue? That means I have tapped it successfully.

I will now tap the arrow.

In this question, instead of tapping something, I need to tap, hold and drag the counter.

I will now tap the arrow.

In this question, I need to tap, hold and drag the counter again. Watch what happens if I don't drag the counter into the box properly. See, it flies back to its starting place. It's important that you drag the counter into the box properly before tapping the arrow. Like this.

I will now tap the arrow.

That's the end of the practice questions!

You might have noticed that the arrow button only goes forwards. There is no backwards arrow, so you won't be able to go back. That's ok! That's just how this activity works — you only move forward through the questions. Just try your best each time.

Well done. You are now ready to complete your own maths test when your teacher asks you to.
